

Weekday Masses in our Churches:

Weekday Masses take place every Monday, Tuesday and Wednesday morning in St. Brigid's Church, Ardagh at 10.00am. The Rosary takes place at 9.30am followed by the Divine Mercy prayers for the sick and the dying. Every Thursday and Friday evening Holy Mass takes place in St. Mary's Church in Moydow at 7.30pm, with the Rosary at 7pm followed by the Divine Mercy prayers. You are very welcome to come to any of our weekday Masses. Every Wednesday after the 10am Mass in St. Brigid's Church the Blessed Sacrament will be exposed for one hour for private prayer and intentions.
