Pope urges Catholics to pray in May foe end to COVID-19 pandemic: Pope Francis invites Catholics and Marian Shrines around the world to dedicate the month of May to a marathon of prayer for an end to COVID-19. The initiative will involve all the Shrines of the world in a special way, so that they might encourage the faithful, families and communities to recite the Rosary to pray for an end to the pandemic. Pope Francis will open the Marian month of prayer on May 1st with a Rosary across the Vatican media's platform. The Pope will close the initiative on 31st May.

This year's dedication of May to pandemic related prayer recalls a similar occurrence during the first wave in March 2020. Pope Francis led the world in prayer during that confusing and difficult time, celebrating a live streamed daily Mass in Casa Santa Marta. And more than a year later, and with the world still in grips of the pandemic, the Pope and the Church around the world are once again leading the way in imploring God for an end to the suffering which so many people are forced to bear.

Fifth Sunday of Easter (The Vine and the branches): Lord, you said, 'I am the vine, you are the branches. Separated from me you can do nothing, but United with me you will bear much fruit.'

Thank you Lord, for the bond you formed with us and thank you for the bond that exists among us because of our union with you. Thanks to this bond, we have invisible riches to share with one another. Grant that we may never be separated from you, so that we may produce in the world the fruits of faith, hope and love.

Easing of Restrictions: We all welcome the easing of restrictions announced by the government. The easing of the restrictions come into force on May 10th. Therefore, weekend Masses will commence in Moydow Church on Saturday May 15th at 7.30pm and in Ardagh on Sunday May 16th. The numbers of people who can attend the Masses are 50. The morning Masses will commence in Ardagh Church on May 10th at 10am. Weekday Masses in Moydow Church on Thursday 13th and Friday 14th May at 7.30pm. I look forward to seeing you all again. It has been a long 4 months with empty churches.

There can be 50 people in attendance at a wedding in the Church. Baptisms can be celebrated again with a maximum of 10 people. Funerals can also have 50 people in attendance.

Ceremony of Light: Tuesday 8th June at 10am in St Brigid's Church, Ardagh.

Confirmation ceremony: The recent announcement by the government on Thursday evening is that 50 people can attend religious services with controls in place and the 2 metre distance respected, however they have advised that 1st Holy Communion and Confirmations should not be held at this time. Having had a zoom meeting with Bishop Francis and diocesan consultants it was decided to defer the 1st Holy Communion to September 2021. It was also decided that the Confirmation Ceremony is a priority before the young people leave their primary education. Therefore the Confirmation ceremony as planned for Saturday 19th June at 11am and 2pm in St. Brigid's Church, Ardagh will go ahead as planned. I would also like to state that Confirmation date of 19th June can be subject to government guidelines at that particular time.
