Gospel Message for this Sunday: The Gospel concerns the cure of a handicapped man. All of us have got our handicaps. The fact that ours are not as visible as those of the man in the Gospel does not make them less real. In one way or another all of us are wounded. We see evidence of this of husbands who take refuge in work because they are no longer attracted to their wives, or wives are who are wounded by lack of attention and love from their husbands, or parents in conflict with their children, or children who don't receive the love they need or who are stifled by parents who might be too possessive. Some people carry deep wounds from bad childhood experiences. Others are wounded by sickness, or by death of a loved one, or by the non-acceptance of themselves. More are wounded by failures in work and in relationships. Many people are wounded by the inability to forgive, and by the experience of rejection. Inside each of us there lies a hidden world of suffering. The deepest wounds are not always visible to the eye. In some people the inner wounds have led to drink or depression. In others the same inner wounds have led to the compelling need to prove themselves, to be successful, to win, to dominate, to be well known, even to save themselves.

Jesus in touching the ears and tongue of that handicapped man, Jesus also touched his wounded heart. It was that above all that made the man new. We too, can receive the same touch from Jesus in today's Gospel of our Holy Mass.

Easing of Restrictions:

From September 6th easing of restrictions will commence for all sectors of the community. Churches can have a 50% capacity at all ceremonies. First Holy Communion and Confirmation ceremonies can commence. Weddings are still confined to 100 guests. Masks must be worn, hand sanitising, no shaking of hands, keeping your distance will still be in place.

First Holy Communion ceremony will be celebrated in St. Brigid's Church with two ceremonies at 11am and 2pm on Saturday 11th September.

The Sacrament of Confirmation will be celebrated on Saturday 9th October with two ceremonies at 11.00 am and at 2.30pm, wishing all our young people preparing for these ceremonies every good blessing along with their families.

Parochial Grounds: No children are to play around the trees, climb or hang out of the trees in the Parochial Grounds at any time. The stone around one of the trees is quite loose so therefore from a health and safety point of view no playing in that area. I ask parents for their cooperation, and various teachers in the local school have mentioned this to the young people.
