Parochial Grounds:

No children are to play around the trees, climb or hang out of the trees in the Parochial Grounds at any time. The stone around one of the trees is quite loose so therefore from a health and safety point of view no playing in that area. I ask parents for their cooperation, and various teachers in the local school have mentioned this to the young people.

Peter's Profession of Faith:

There are two kinds of Faith. The first is the Faith of those who believe because they follow the traditions of their ancestors, maintaining their tradition of faith. The second is the Faith of those who gained it through reason and philosophical thinking. The second could be called a personal Faith. The question Jesus asked the apostles is the most important question in the Gospel. It concerns the identity of Jesus. He asked the question not for his own sake but for their sake. It's a question that forces people to think about their beliefs.

'Who do people say I am'? Peter replied 'you are the Christ'. This is the core faith on which the church was founded. We need to grow in our understanding of the faith. We must believe out of personal conviction. It is clear that Peter didn't fully understand what he said. When he recognised Jesus as the Messiah, he didn't know that Jesus would be a suffering Messiah. This was something Peter had to learn. Peter made a perfect profession of faith. He got it right with his words. But when it came to acting on that Faith, he failed. His lowest point was when he denied he ever knew Jesus. This shows us that we need God's Grace, not only to profess our faith, but also to live it.
