The Parable of the Mustard Seed: Using many parables, Jesus spoke to them. We have two parables in today's Gospel. Parables were a teaching technique used by Jesus as a way to lead people into a new way of listening. They were not instructions to provide information and they were not fables. Parables were and are invitations to pray and to listen in a radical way. Jesus talked a lot about listening. For Jesus, listening is about receiving through the heart, where love is lodged and guides us. Jesus met resistance in his day from those often closest to him as well as those who were intent to ruin his plan of God's kind purpose for us. His parable word to us is like a seed that drifts onto soil it did not choose. His word is like a seed that is received in an unexpected soil. God's mustard seed of love is like a life that blossoms in surprising ways, beyond our imagination.

Seeds. Sowers. Soil. Add another S – word - Spirit. A harvest of 30, 60, 100 fold is promised by an extravagant Jesus, which startles us out of our rigid narrow miserliness. Let us ponder, trust and explore the impossible possibilities of abundant life that flourish whenever we pause, pray, listen and love.

Fr Vincent's Anniversary: On Wednesday June 16th Fr Vinny will be 36 years ordained a priest. We thank God for his priesthood and the priesthood of all our priest's in our Diocese of Ardagh and Clonmacnoise.
