The Feast of the Assumption of Mary:

The feast of Mary's Assumption says that there is one human being who is already completely redeemed, saved body and soul. That person is Mary, the mother of Jesus. Since she gave birth to him, and was immediately in the work of salvation, it is only right that she should share the full fruits of his victory over death. The Assumption means that after physical death, Mary's body was not allowed not to remain on earth to corrupt, but was caused by God to come into its transfigured and glorified state. Mary has passed beyond death, and



the glory she now shares is the same glory we hope to enjoy also. By declaring that Mary was assumed body and soul into heaven the church is declaring that the whole person will be saved, and affirms the goodness of all material reality. The bodily glorification of Mary is the anticipation of the glorification that is the destiny of all. We can look at her now in glory and say "That is how we will be one day".

A Reflection:

Life could be compared to a stream. In its journey to the sea, a stream cannot always advance by the shortest route, but has to twist and turn, and pause a while here and there, without ever coming to a complete stop. And yet in spite of all this dallying, in spite of all these detours, how quickly life's stream runs down to the sea. Lord, may your gentle hand guide us, so that in spite of doubts, difficulties and dangers, we may keep the stream of our lives flowing towards your kingdom. *Amen*.
