Recent Bereavement's:



Easter Sunday - Easter Joy - Easter Peace:

Mary Magdalene cuts a lonely figure as she begins her Easter journey, the outer darkness merely reflecting her inner emptiness. He who had once found her, and brought purpose to her life, now

seems lost himself and beyond all that matters. The one blessing in Mary's grief, perhaps, is that it seems to free her from the caution of those male disciples. They in fact, will require her prompting before venturing near the tomb of Jesus. Mary, in turn, is fittingly rewarded, becoming the first to encounter the Risen One. The disciple Jesus loved plays his own unique role in the unfolding drama. While Peter takes the lead in entering the tomb, his companion is the first to understand. "He saw and he believed". Peter in turn is not to be found lacking. The Easter scriptures place him at the centre of the preaching of the gospel. His hearers recognise, in Peter, no chronicle of past events, but one who speaks from the heart about a new life in which he himself shares. The witness of course, does not end with the stories of these three Easter figures. St Paul continues the



mission of today's liturgy, inviting us, also, to that new life hidden with Christ in God. Committed to the things that are in heaven, we pray that our lives might better reflect the Christ who is risen and at work among us. It is surely fitting that we recall, this day, the promises of our own baptism. Happy Easter.
