**Thoughts on today's Readings**. We can learn a lot from Ryanair. The minimum of luggage. Forgiveness means the excess baggage overboard. It can be such a relief when we let go. Just think of examples of hurts or injustices done to us. The more we hang onto them, the greater they become. Did Jesus really mean it when he said, 'Love your enemies' and 'forgive seventy times seven'. He not only meant it, but he carried it out in his own life and especially on the cross. This example of supreme forgiveness is at the heart of Jesus own life and death. This is the reason why we need to be forgiving to each other. We need to let go of anger, resentment, revenge and grudges. Because God forgives us, Jesus has taken our sins and failings on himself, so that we can be reconciled to God and one another. It is in forgiving others that we are forgiven by God. By embracing mercy and forgiveness, we can in fact embrace peace, joy, gratitude and well-being. By letting go of the hurt, resentment and nasty thoughts of revenge can we make space for compassion, understanding and peace of mind. Resentment and harbouring grudges can eat into the very core of our being. It colours how we live and can remove the joys of life. As we saw in the scriptures last week, we have no eyes for goodness when it comes our way. It is not a question of forgetting the hurt done to us but dealing with it, letting go, getting rid of the baggage that holds us down. God presses his delete button, we need to do the same.

**Trocaire 2022.** Archbishop Alex has sent a letter to Trocaire this year and for Lent 2022, to appeal for your generosity through the Trocaire boxes. He says "In the spirit of faith and humanity, today I appeal to you, please open your hearts as much as possible to the people of Zimbabwe this Lent". We are serving in my Archdiocese of the southern and south western corner of Zimbabwe, the people are very poor. Water is scarce, there is drought and food shortage. Animals are dying for lack of water. The pandemic has brought more poverty and hardship. Our children have lost almost two years, not going to school. For families like Thandekiles on your Lenten boxes this year, who have lost a husband and father during covid, they are suffering. Please pray for us. Ask your parishes to give this Lent. Keep this partnership with Trocaire alive, as Catholics in communion with Zimbabwe. Archbishop says we have nothing to give you back only our prayers and our gratefulness.
