Divine Mercy Sunday - Second Sunday of Easter:

A humble Polish Nun, St. Faustina received extraordinary revelations in the 1930's, which she received in her diary. Our Lord told her, "In the Old Covenant I sent prophets wielding thunderbolts to my people. Today I am sending you my mercy to the people of the whole world". Jesus specially chose St. Faustina for the mission of bringing His message of Mercy to the world, and He called it Divine Mercy Sunday mankind's "last hope of salvation". Pray the Chaplet of St Faustina in the words of Jesus who said to her "Encourage souls to say the Chaplet in which I have given to you. Whoever will recite it, will receive great mercy at the hour of death". The Divine Mercy message and devotion has been called the largest grassroots in the history of the Catholic Church. Divine Mercy Sunday is perhaps God's greatest gift for our time. The promise of this day is nothing less than the forgiveness of all sins and punishment due to sin for anyone who would go to confession and receive Holy Communion on this very special feast. St. Pope John Paul 11 officially established the Feast of Divine Mercy in the year 2000, after many years of study by the Catholic Church. Jesus told St. Faustina that she was to prepare the world for His second coming and that He would be pouring out His mercy in great abundance before He comes again as the Just Judge. Many feel that their sins are unforgivable, but Jesus said, "Were a soul like a decaying corpse, so that from a human standpoint, there would be no hope of restoration and everything would already be lost, it is not so with God. The miracle of Divine Mercy restores that soul in full. Today's feast is so beautiful and so powerful.
