World Day of Migrants and Refugees: The Church has always been celebrating the World Day of Migrants and Refugees since 1914. It's always an occasion to express concern for different vulnerable people on the move, to pray for them as they face many challenges, and to increase awareness about the opportunities that migration offers. The Vatican has a dedicated section for Migrants and Refugees. It is directed by Pope Francis and aims to help the Church, and others, to accompany those forced to flee and make sure they are not shut out or left behind.

Pope's Message: In the Encyclical Letter Fratelli Tutti he expressed a concern and desire which still occupy an important place in his heart. "Salvation history sees us at the beginning and us at the end, a humanity united in Jesus Christ 'that they may all be one'. We are all in the same boat and we are called to commit ourselves so there are no more walls that separate us, so that there are no more others, but only one us, and us as big as the whole community. For this reason I would like to take advantage of this happy occasion to launch a double appeal to walk towards an ever wider us, one addressed to the Catholic faithful and one addressed to all men and women of the world. The Church recognises full citizenship for all Catholics and puts this citizenship before nationality, which is the result of human constructions. Today the Church is called to go out into the streets of the existential peripheries, to heal the wounded and seek out the lost, without fear or prejudice, and to welcome everyone. The current influx of migrants can be seen as a new frontier for mission, a privileged opportunity to proclaim Jesus Christ and the Gospel message at home, and to bear concrete witness to the Christian faith in a spirit of charity and profound esteem for other religious communities.

Day for Life 2021: This year's *Day for Life* will be celebrated in Ireland on Sunday 3rd October on the theme 'The Good Samaritan: A Model of Compassion'. In the context of the recent proposal to introduce assisted suicide, both in Ireland and the UK, this year's *Day for Life* message invites Catholics to consider a more positive and compassionate response to the care of people who are in the final stages of life.
