
# Remembering those who died:

# Which is the greatest Commandment:

In the Bible we see that God is deeply concerned about the way we treat one another. Our vocation is to love. And, in spite of everything, we are moved by altruism. We are touched by the pain of other people. We feel enlarged by doing good, more so than by doing well materially or financially. Generosity brings its own rewards. Joy springs up within us when we do a good deed for another. But when we refuse to do a good deed for another, a strange sadness descends on us. Miamonides was a Jewish teacher who lived in Spain in the twelfth century. He outlined eight degrees or steps in what he called the ladder of charity.

1. The first and lowest step is to give, but with reluctance or regret. 2. The second is to give cheerfully, but not in proportion to the distress of the sufferers. 3. The third is to give cheerfully, but not until we are asked. 4. The fourth is to give cheerfully, but to put it into the poor person's hand,



thereby exciting in him/her the painful emotion of shame. 5. The fifth is to give in such a way that the needy may receive the alms and know their benefactor, without the benefactor knowing them. 6. The sixth is to know the recipients of our charity, while remaining unknown to them. 7. The seventh is to bestow charity in such a way that the benefactor does not know the recipient, or the recipient the benefactor. 8. The eight is to anticipate charity by preventing poverty. This can be done by giving a gift or a loan of money to enable him/her a trade, or by putting them in the way of business, so that they may earn an honest livelihood, and not be forced to the dreadful alternative.

**November - Remembrance Month:** For November there will be special envelopes and lists of the dead where you can write out all your deceased names and they will be remembered in our weekday Masses throughout November, you may wish to leave a stipend for the deceased in the envelope provided. Bereavement Ceremony will take place in St. Brigid's Church on Tuesday 9<sup>th</sup> November at 7.30pm for all who had bereavements in our parish during this past year or so. November prayers and blessing of graves will take place in Ardagh cemetery on Sunday the 21<sup>st</sup> November immediate after the 11am Mass. Prayers and blessing in Moydow cemetery will also take place on the same Sunday (21<sup>st</sup> Nov) at 2pm. You will be very welcome to attend these ceremonies and feel free to pass on this information to others who are outside the parish.
